ORDINANCE NO. 10-20

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE DIRECTOR OF SAFETY AND SERVICE TO APPLY FOR, ACCEPT, AND ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT ON BEHALF OF THE CITY OF PORT CLINTON WITH THE OHIO EPA'S DIVISION OF ENVIRONMENTAL AND FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE (DEFA) TO OBTAIN FUNDING FOR THE CITY'S LAKEVIEW BEACH PROJECT AND DECARE AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, high lake levels at Lakeview Park Beach have caused a large portion of the beach at Lakeview Park to be submerged, allowing wave energy to reach farther onshore; and

WHEREAS, this has resulted in scour and displacement of sand into the nearshore or onto adjacent beach areas; and

WHEREAS, DEFA has funding available to assist with public projects, and

WHEREAS, the City's Lakeview Beach Park Project is eligible for funding and receiving this funding will benefit the City and its residents, and

WHEREAS, it is necessary for City Council to adopt legislation authorizing the filing of an application and executing the necessary agreements and documents required to participate in the funding program, now therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Port Clinton, County of Ottawa and State of Ohio:

Section 1. The Director of Safety and Service is hereby authorized and directed to apply for, accept, and enter into an agreement on behalf of the City of Port Clinton with the DEFA to obtain funding up to \$18,000.00 for the Lakeview Beach Park Project.

Section 2. The Director of Safety and Service, the City Auditor, the Law Director, and other City officials, as applicable, are each authorized and directed to sign any transcript certificates, financial statements, and other documents and instruments and to take such actions as are necessary or appropriate to consummate the transaction contemplated by this Ordinance.

Section 3. This Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council and any of its committees concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council or committees, and that all deliberations of this Council, and any of its committees, that resulted in those actions were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with the law.

Section 4. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety of the City, and for further reason that this Ordinance is required to be immediately effective in order for the City to apply for funding from DEFA to assist in remedying the emergency condition at the

City Beach and assist the City in financing this necessary public project to benefit the City

and its inhabitants,

Wherefore, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.
