AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING CERTAIN FUNDS FOR THE OPERATION OF THE
CITY OF PORT CLINTON, OHIO.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Port Clinton, Ottawa County, Ohio:

Section 1.
