

RESOLUTION 22 - 2

A RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF GRANT APPLICATIONS TO THE OTTAWA-SANDUSKY-SENECA JOINT SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT DISTRICT, AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE DIRECTOR OF SAFETY AND SERVICE TO SUBMIT SUCH APPLICATIONS, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the Ottawa-Sandusky-Seneca Joint Solid Waste Management District has two competitive funding programs a year that provide grant funding to local governments, educational institutions, and non-profit organizations for solid waste programs; and

WHEREAS, the City's Director of Safety and Service has identified needs that can be funded using the Joint Solid Waste Management District's Competitive Funding Programs; and

WHEREAS, the local match, including in-kind service, can be met through the Parks and Recreation Department budget; and

WHEREAS, the Director of Safety and Service intends to apply for funding for recycled plastic six-foot picnic tables in the first cycle and items he will apply for will be determined for the next cycle based on the needs of the City at that time; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Port Clinton, Ottawa County, State of Ohio:

Section 1. The Director of Safety and Service is hereby authorized and directed to prepare and submit each application on/or by the application date, on behalf of the City, the competitive funding program grant applications to the Ottawa-Sandusky-Seneca Joint Solid Waste District, along with all necessary supporting documentation for the Ottawa-Sandusky-Seneca Joint Solid Waste District to consider the City's Grant request of up to, but not to exceed \$10,000 for each grant cycle.

Section 2. The City hereby agrees to fund the 25% local match requirements in support of these grant applications to be submitted to the Ottawa-Sandusky-Seneca Joint Solid Waste District.

Section 3. This Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this resolution were taken in an open meeting of the Council and that all deliberations of the Council and of any committees that resulted in those formal actions are in meeting open to the public in compliance with the law.

Section 4. This Resolution is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the City, and for further reason that this Resolution is required to be immediately effective so that it can timely be filed by the January 31, 2022 deadline; wherefore, this Resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its adoption and approval by the Mayor.
