

ORDINANCE 39 -22

AN ORDINANCE CREATING RESIDENTIAL PARKING RESTRICTIONS THAT PROHIBIT PARKING OR STORING MOTOR VEHICLES, CAMPERS, BOATS, AND WATERCRAFT IN A FRONT YARD OR A SIDE YARD ABUTTING A STREET OR ALLEY ON A PROPERTY USED FOR RESIDENTIAL PURPOSES AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, no person shall park a motor vehicle or store a camper, boat, or watercraft on an unpaved portion of a front yard of a property used for residential purposes; and

WHEREAS, no person shall park a motor vehicle, or store a camper, boat, or watercraft on an unpaved portion of a side yard of a property used for residential purposes if that side yard abuts a street or alley; and

WHEREAS, this Council has an interest in providing options to law enforcement to enforce the residential parking restrictions enumerated in this section.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PORT CLINTON, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. Residential Parking Restrictions.

(a) No person shall park a motor vehicle, or store a camper, boat or watercraft, on an unpaved portion of a front yard of a property used for residential purposes.

(b) No person shall park a motor vehicle, or store a camper, boat or watercraft, on an unpaved portion of a side yard used for residential purposes if that side yard abuts a street or alley.

Section 2. Penalty

(a) Whoever violates this section is guilty of a minor misdemeanor.

Section 3. This Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council and any of its committees concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council or committees, and that all deliberations of this Council, and any of its committees, that resulted in those actions were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with the law.

Section 4. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the inhabitants of the City and for the further reason that it is necessary to enact this Ordinance immediately to give law enforcement the ability to enforce the residential parking restrictions enumerated in this section; wherefore, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.
